He is forced to cope with Poppy's confusion and memory loss, while keeping a constant eye out for Poppy's safety and wellbeing. Zeb also faces bullying and teasing from his classmates about Poppy's strange behaviour. In the end Zeb learns to cope with Poppy's illness and take advantage of the time they still have together.
